F. High School Student Organization Report - no report tonight

Dr. Nagler stated it is always a joy and pleasure to recognize our students. He introduced Mr. Joe Owens to talk about our all county music students. Mr. Owens stated that what our children do here in Mineola is outstanding. We had 18 students represented at an Art Show in March at Farmingdale College. Our Art Show is currently going on as you can see by everything displayed in the hallway. Christopher Ciccone is our Art Supervisors Associate Senior Scholarship winner. His art work was also featured at the Heckscher Museum of Art in Huntington as one of long island's best. Dr. Nagler asked Dr. Smith to the podium. He spoke about Vijay Paliath who was a finalist in the 2018 National Merit Scholarship Completion. Next Dr. Smith spoke about Ryan DeMagistris who was the News 12 Scholar Athlete. Mr. Fretz came up to the podium to speak about Ryan.

Dr. Nagler handed the meeting over to Mr. Gaven and Dr. Smith to do a presentation on our Queensborough Community College Program. They updated the Board on our partnership with QCC which offers our high school students a pathway to earn college credits. Two students spoke about their positive experiences in this program.

G. BOE Reports

1. Comments from Board Trustees

Cheryl Lampasona attended the Jackson Avenue's second Ted Talk. She stated it was nothing short of an amazing feat for 8 year olds presenting various topics. She thanked Ms. Helming and Ms. Moreano who worked tirelessly with these students. She looks forward to see what the other buildings will do. She said it is really exciting.

2. Comments from Board President

Christine Napolitano stated Ted Talk gives students the opportunity to do public speaking which is something very valuable. She is proud of the work that we do. She is also looking forward to the other Ted Talks in the other buildings.

3. Comments from Superintendent

Dr. Nagler stated that each building is doing a separate TedEd Club event but we will be having a special event on May 19th which we are calling Mineola Proud Day. He handed the meeting over to Mr. Gaven to talk about it. He stated that we are taking the idea of TedEd to Mineola Proud Day. We are going to host two or three students from each building and we will put on a 2-12 continuum of Ted Talks for the community. The event will take place between 10 a.m. and 12 p.m. at the high school. We will also have a K-12 exhibition of Robotics, a K-12 exhibition of coding and steam projects and also K-12 project of Maker. We also shot most of a quick commercial which we will put out there shortly for the community. Dr. Nagler stated that Mineola Proud Day is a giant celebration of the work our kids do and to really showcase the K-12 continuum.

Dr. Nagler stated he is very proud to report on our very first Robotics competition and our rookie team and our coaches Andrew Woosley and Kuri DiFede. We did three competitions. We won the rookie inspiration award and we also won the rookie all-star award. This award affords us the ability to go to the national championships in Detroit in two weeks. Dr. Nagler asked the Board's permission to pay the registration fee and some other fees associated with this so the team can go to Detroit. Dr. Nagler praised Andrew Woosley and Kuri DiFede for going above and beyond for this team. We are the only district in Nassau County that has all four levels of the first robotics.

Since our last meeting there was the Pajama Game which was fabulous. He praised Matt DeLuca and the cast. The next play is the Adams Family on May 4th and May 5th directed by Aislinn Oliveri. There will not be a meet the candidate night this year because you know your candidates. Christine Napolitano and Brian Widman are running unopposed. There will be a joint PTA meeting on April 30th where Dr. Nagler will present the Budget. The formal Budget Hearing will be May 3rd. Lastly, Dr. Nagler reported another event that took place was the BOCES Gala that recognized educational partnerships and our very own Christine Napolitano was recognized as a fabulous educational leader in Nassau County. Dr. Nagler congratulated Ms. Napolitano. The board presented Ms. Napolitano with flowers. Ms. Napolitano thanked everyone. Dr. Nagler reported that for the tenth consecutive year Mineola has been named a best community for music education by the NAM organization.
