# I. Superintendent's Reports

Mr. Escobar presented an overview of the academic program (Curriculum, instruction, and assessment) of the Mineola High School to the Board of Education. Mr. Escobar read the High School's mission statement; "Well rounded individuals, good decision making, provide enrichment and support, meet the needs of all students". He also discussed the following: requirements for taking Regents exams and receiving Regents Diplomas; assessing what students actually know; course descriptions and offerings; AP courses and the number of students taking them; alignment of courses with New York State standards; new course work at the High School; Science Research Program; a number of students entered Science competitions; teachers learning and understanding how to assess; implementing formative assessments and performance indicators; using assessments and applying them in a better and more effective manner; and to continue to improve student achievement.

President Hale thanked Mr. Escobar for his presentation.

Mr. Hornberger expressed concerns that he heard from parents regarding students in the middle being most at risk and needing extra assistance. Mr. Escobar stated that the High School had a meeting in December where that issue was discussed.

Ms. Napolitano inquired about assessing classrooms. Mr. Escobar responded that the Assistant Principals do the formal assessments and discussed how teachers are evaluated. The Superintendent of Schools stated that an administrator determines when a teacher needs in-depth supervision. His goal is for all Mineola teachers to be exceptional. The Superintendent of Schools stated that the next window of testing for NWEA, February 14 and 15. Ms. Napolitano inquired about NWEA information being processed by teachers. The Superintendent of Schools responded that the teachers have to do content and differentiate students' skills simultaneously. The Superintendent of Schools also discussed: 8th grade Science and Math and if that grades becomes part of the High School. Ms. Napolitano inquired if graduate students stay in college or transfer to a lesser institution. Ms. Napolitano stated that children should be where they are most comfortable to excel. The Superintendent of Schools stated that children who graduate with an AP Diploma are more prepared for college. Mr. Hale inquired as to what Mr. Escobar's expectations were for 2011. Mr. Escobar responded to increase the number of students taking and passing AP and Regents courses.

The Superintendent of Schools wished Mr. Escobar a happy birthday.

### J. Public Comments

President Hale invited the public to address the Board with their comments and concerns:

A resident requested clarification regarding the difference between a Regents Diploma and an Advanced Placement Diploma. The Superintendent of Schools responded that most students take AP courses. The Superintendent of Schools stated that the workload for students taking many AP courses is tremendous. The resident stated her daughter enjoyed taking AP courses. Her son did not take AP courses, and feels he is not challenged enough. The Superintendent of Schools responded that years ago when he was Principal they had Honors classes, AP, and Regents and self-contained in each grade of 200 kids. It is difficult to track 4 different sections, and what you think is an Honors class is not. The label is what parents want. The resident stated she thinks the district is on the right track. The resident commented that the Middle School is where organizational skills are formed. The Superintendent of Schools responded that technology can play a role, i.e. using iPads.

The Superintendent of Schools made the following announcements: a free show at Mineola High School on February 8, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. (Mark Wood); first meeting of committee (Parents, Teachers, residents, Principals, Administrators) addressing the Hampton addition project, and they will be meeting on January 26<sup>th</sup> to come up with the final project; he and Mr. Waters will be meeting with SED to review Hampton and Jackson projects to get preliminary okay before filing official documents; Solomon Schechter is having an open house January 9, 2011 at Cross for their constituency; iPad presentation in March at the Board's workshop meeting held at Jackson Avenue School; presentation at January 20<sup>th</sup> meeting in what a Pre-K – 2 building looks like; January 7<sup>th</sup> is Alumni Day where alumni come back and meet with the Juniors and Seniors; last cultural arts show (Magic of Robert Austin) at Mineola High School, January 8, 2011 at 2:00 p.m.

The Superintendent of Schools expressed that he is in need of a Board of Education executive session.
