# **RESOLUTION #52**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Mineola Union Free School District may establish a reserve fund pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law for the purpose of financing retirement system contributions to the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Mineola Union Free School District hereby establishes a reserve fund pursuant to Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law, to be known as the Mineola School District Retirement Contribution Reserve Fund, for the purpose of financing retirement contributions to the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Mineola Union Free School District hereby authorizes and directs the Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations to transfer monies from unappropriated unreserved fund balance for the 2019-2020 school year, in an amount not to exceed \$ 760,000 to such Reserve Fund.

### **Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS**

# RESOLUTION #53

WHEREAS, the Mineola Union Free School District (the "School District") participates in the New York State Teachers' Retirement System ("TRS"); and

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2020, the Board of Education of the Mineola Union Free School District (the "Board") by resolution established a Retirement Contribution Reserve Fund known as the Retirement Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined it is also appropriate to establish a sub-fund within the Retirement Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law to finance contributions to TRS and/or to offset all or a portion of the amount deducted from the moneys apportioned to the School District from the State for the support of schools pursuant to Section 521 of the Education Law;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Education of the Mineola Union Free School District (the "Board"), pursuant to Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law, as follows:

- 1. The Board hereby establishes a sub-fund within the Retirement Reserve Fund to be known as the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS;
- 2. The source of funds for the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS shall be:
  - a. Such amounts as may be provided therefore by budgetary appropriation or raised by tax therefore;
  - b. Such revenues as are not required by law to be paid into any other fund or account;
  - c. Such other funds as may be legally appropriated; and
  - d. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, such amounts as may be transferred from a reserve fund established pursuant to Section 6-c, 6-d, 6-e, 6-f or 6-g of Article 2 of the General Municipal Law, comprised of moneys raised from the same tax base as the moneys in the retirement contribution reserve fund, or a reserve fund established pursuant to Education Law Section 3651, provided that any such transfer shall only be made by Board resolution adopted after a public hearing held on at least 15 days prior notice published in at least one newspaper having general circulation in the School District.
- 3. By resolution, the Board may authorize expenditures from the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS. Except as otherwise provided by law, moneys in the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS may only be appropriated to finance retirement contributions to the TRS, and/or to offset all or a portion of the amount deducted from the moneys apportioned to the School District from the State for the support of schools pursuant to Section 521 of the Education Law.
- 4. No member of the Board or employee of the School District shall:
  - a. Authorize a withdrawal from the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS for any purpose except as provided in Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law; or
  - b. expend any money withdrawn from the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS for a purpose other than as provided in Section 6-r of the General Municipal Law.
- 4. The moneys contributed annually to the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS shall not exceed 2% of the total compensation or salaries of all teachers (as that term is defined in Education Law §501[4]) employed by the School District who are members of TRS paid during the

immediately preceding fiscal year.

- 5. The balance of the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS shall not exceed 10% of the total compensation or salaries of all teachers (as that term is defined in Education Law §501[4]) employed by the School District who are members of TRS paid during the immediately preceding fiscal year.
- 6. The moneys in the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS shall be deposited and secured in the manner provided by Section 10 of the General Municipal Law. The Board or its authorized designee may invest the moneys in the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS in the manner provided by Section 11 of the General Municipal Law. Any interest earned or capital gain realized on the money so deposited or invested shall accrue to and become part of the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS.
- 7. The Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations shall account for the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS separate and apart from all other funds of the School District. Such accounting shall show: the source, date and amount of each sum paid into this Sub-Fund; the interest earned by this Sub-Fund; capital gains or losses resulting from the sale of investments of this Sub-Fund; the order, purpose thereof, date and amount of each payment from this Sub-Fund; the assets of this Sub-Fund, indicating cash balance and a schedule of investments. The Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations, within sixty (60) days of the end of each fiscal year, shall furnish a detailed report of the operation and condition of this Sub-Fund to the Board.
- 8. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hereby authorizes and directs the Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations to transfer monies from unappropriated unreserved fund balance for the 2019-2020 school year, in an amount not to exceed \$760,000, to the Retirement Reserve Sub-Fund for TRS.
